PRS30303 Certificate III in Investigative Services

Program Overview

This course replaces Private Inquiry Agency Practice Certificate III and in preparing this program outline Beltin Group has had regard to the expressed needs of a professional Investigator. Certificate III in Investigative Services (PRS30303) is now a pre requisite for Investigator licensing in all states of Australia. Students graduating from this qualification are able to apply for a Private Inquiry Agent License in all states subject to probity, character and any state specific requirements.

In preparing this program outline Beltin has regard to the expressed needs of a professional with a role or involvement in Investigations, security advice, supervision and management.

Additionally team topics are available for each unit of competency. Participants are able to practice working with a group and discussing issues with other participants. This gives a chance for participants to learn communication skills such as consulting, sharing ideas and considering other points of view, which are paramount to a security risk manager's role.

Apart from working towards a nationally recognised qualification, Participants will be increasing their skills and knowledge in the Investigations industry as a whole.

As the principles across the industry are similar, participants will be able to take what they have learnt from one industry area and apply this to other areas.

Assessment Strategy

To achieve this qualification the candidate must have demonstrated competency against all 12 core units plus 3 elective units. Up to two of the required three electives may be selected from other relevant endorsed Training Package qualifications aligned at the Certificate III level.

Each unit has a series of tasks for participants to complete. These tasks are based on participants solving possible real life problems that occur as part of working in the security industry. Participants leave this course with a professional portfolio of assessed works to act as a professional resource guide.

Qualification of this course is achieved through a demonstration of relevant theoretical knowledge. Apply a range of well-developed skills. Apply known solutions to a variety of predictable problems.
